


REPORT ON THE ACTIVITIES OF ZAPORUKA FOUNDATION IN 2023



ZAPORUKA IN 2023



In 2023, our assistance for the SUPPORT FOR MEDICAL INSTITUTIONS AND SEVERELY ILL PATIENTS program amounted to 37.502.584.27 UAH.

We supported **13 hospitals** in Kyiv, Lviv, Kyiv, Lviv, and Cherkasy Oblasts, providing over **1,000 patients** with medications, endoprostheses, medical supplies, and examinations to ensure timely and continuous medical care.

We opened the facilities of the first Physical Rehabilitation Center in Oncology at the National Cancer Institute in Kyiv, renovated part of the reception units at the Western Ukrainian Specialized Children's Medical Center in Lviv, participated in the renovation and equipment of the Unbroken Kids rehabilitation department at the First Medical Association of Lviv, and set up a multi-section prosthetic workshop for the Unbroken Center.

Our assistance for the **FAMILY HOUSE DACHA** program amounted to **10,119,718.70 UAH.** After five years of construction with the support of over 65 partners, we opened a new Dacha – a home for families treating children at the National Cancer Institute and Okhmatdyt. The house has 15 family rooms for living, common areas including a kitchen and dining room, a family support complex with a psychologist's rooms, play and study areas, a physical rehabilitation room, and a soundproof relaxation room. In the first two months of

operation, Dacha hosted **32 children** and **45 of their family members.**

The total assistance for our **PHYSICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL REHABILITATION** program amounted to **7,991,019.01 UAH**.

Our physiotherapists helped **64 children** complete rehabilitation courses after surgeries and other complex procedures, conducting **1,022 sessions** both in the therapeutic exercise room at the National Cancer Institute and online. Additionally, we published a motivational book titled "Never Give Up!" to support children undergoing rehabilitation.

Our team of psychologists provided **2,594 consultations** for **424 critically ill children** and **2,295 consultations** for **456 of their family members.** These consultations were both individual and group sessions.

For Ukrainians affected by the war, we operated a psychological hotline where specialists provided **4,571 hours of consultations** for **3,077 individuals.**

In Neslukhiv, Lviv Oblast, 24 internally displaced families, including 10 children, received psychological supported while living in a house we renovated: 23 group training sessions and 219 individual consultations were provided.

To brighten the difficult lives of children in the hospital, we revived our volunteer program this year. Volunteers conducted **90 events,** including creative workshops, puppet theaters, science shows, mindfulness sessions, music therapy, and much more.

Our assistance for the **SUPPORT FOR THOSE AFFECTED BY THE WAR** program amounted to **12,570,747.67 UAH.** We helped IDPs persons and others affected by the war in Kherson, Kyiv, Cherkasy, Poltava, and Lviv Oblasts: **over 3,000 families** received essential items, including winter supplies, **over 700 families** received financial assistance, and we renovated and equipped shelters.

Expenses for the ENHANCING THE CAPACITY OF THE CIVIL SECTOR AND SUPPORTING WOMEN DURING THE WAR project amounted to 12,129,113.99 UAH. We supported women's organizations in Cherkasy, Poltava, and Lviv Oblasts, and together we created spaces for women and children so that families could return to active lives.

Non-program expenses of the foundation amounted to **7,872,513.33 UAH (8.73%).**
